"The Undertakers of Jesus"

Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus, and Pilate gave him permission. So he came and took away His body. Nicodemus also, who earlier had come to Jesus by night, came bringing a mixture of aloes, about seventy-five pounds in weight. So they took the body of Jesus and bound it in linen clothes with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews. Now in the place where he was crucified there was garden, and in the garden a new tomb ...since the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there. ... John 19:38-42

When I attended the seminary in Fort Wayne, I spent ½ of my nights working at Sloan and Son's Funeral home. It was a creepy job, but it paid descent and most of my time was spent sleeping or removing the deceased in the community. Taking care of the dead is not a job most people want to be a part of, but it is a job we expect the funeral homes to handle. What was it like for Joseph and Nicodemus to physically carry the corpse of Jesus from the cross to Joseph's tomb? Along with being Jesus' undertakers, Joseph and Nicodemus were "secret disciples," who believed in Jesus and tried to hide their faith from others.

All four Gospels tell us about Joseph. Matthew tells us he was rich, that he wrapped Jesus' body in a long sheet of linen, and that the tomb was Joseph's own. Mark emphasizes that Joseph was an honored member of the Jewish High Council (the Sanhedrin), and that he was waiting for the kingdom of God. He says that Joseph took courage in approaching Pilate. Luke calls Joseph a good and righteous member of the Sanhedrin, who had not agreed with the decision and action of the council to condemn Jesus. John comes right out and calls him a fearful "secret disciple." What was Joseph afraid of? The opinions of his peers. Their judgment, perhaps. He was afraid he could lose status, his social position. Having seen

the unjust rush to execute Jesus, Joseph had real reason to fear physical danger.

Nevertheless, he was on the council itself—he was in the position to make an actual difference, if anyone could. Had Joseph taken a public stand for Jesus, would it have changed the outcome? Probably not. But at least he would have taken a stand. He finally reached the point where he would rather face the public danger of coming out for Jesus than to face the private shame of doing nothing. So he steps forward. Coming forward when he does and asking for the body took courage, because in doing so, he was declaring his love for Jesus. The word used in the Gospels indicates that Joseph had to beg for Pilate's permission. A condemned man had no right to burial—that was part of the shame of crucifixion. It's shocking that Pilate even allowed it. Joseph doesn't stand alone. Nicodemus joins him, another member of the Sanhedrin, another secret disciple we learn about in John chapter 3. Two secret disciples come together, and the result is they gain the courage to go public with their faith. My point is, if you stand up for Jesus, somebody else may very well do so too. They would gain courage from your courage. Jesus wants you to stand up for Him, to let people know where your faith is. Don't be ashamed of Him or afraid of what others will say. If you belong to Him, sooner or later, your commitment to Jesus will demand you go public. Jesus said, ***"If anyone is ashamed of me and my message in these adulterous and sinful days, the Son of Man will be ashamed of that person when he returns in the glory of his Father with the holy angels"*** (Mark 8.38).

May God grant us the courage to "go public" with our faith letting the world know that Jesus is our Lord and Savior. Invite others to join you in worship and belief in Jesus, who died and rose that you may have forgiveness and eternal life in heaven.

PRINCE OF PEACE PANCAKE MEALS WILL BENEFIT STABILITY FIRST

The Social Ministry Committee of Martinsville's Prince of Peace Lutheran Church is planning two special events to benefit the work of Stability First. A pancake supper is planned for the evening of Saturday, April 14, from 5:00 – 7:00 p.m. The following morning, on Sunday, April 15, they will host a very similar pancake breakfast, from 10:30 a.m. until noon. Meals will include pancakes, scrambled eggs, sausage links, coffee, milk and juice. Both events will be held in Luther Hall, adjacent to the church located at 3496 East Morgan Street in Martinsville. Tickets for either meal will cost \$5 per person or \$15 per family. Tickets may be purchased at the church office or by calling 342-2004.

Proceeds from the pancake meals will be used to further the mission of Stability First, a local ministry focused on addressing multiple issues associated with the alleviation of poverty. It operates a shelter for homeless women, the Magdalene House, as well as transitional housing for those who have taken several positive steps toward living independently. Shelter residents are guided through an individualized stability plan. Depending upon the need, support services include educational resources, job readiness skills, health & wellness opportunities, addiction recovery programs, transportation resources, mental health services, spiritual guidance and other resources. Some of these opportunities are also offered for community residents at the adjacent Lynay Community Resource Center. Central Nine Career Center offers high school equivalency exam prep classes at the center two evenings per week. Other opportunities at the center include addiction recovery group meetings, support and stability counseling for under-resourced men, and a soon-to-open skill building business – the Maggie Bag project worksite.

The Social Ministry at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church puts faith into action. Working with Stability First is an excellent way for our congregation members of all ages to serve God and our local community. We believe that sharing our blessings is part of sharing the Gospel.



What is a Desert Rose?

You have heard about this shelter many times, as have I, but I was not aware of what it was and what the facility here in Martinsville does for the community.

Desert Rose is a place for battered women and their children typically from other counties here in Indiana. Understandably, they cannot stay in the area from which they are fleeing, so when they call for help, they are given shelter and sent to a community some distance away from those who do them harm.

Desert Rose and the sister shelters in other communities offer temporary emergency housing, safety, counseling, intervention, as well as basic legal counseling and assistance in filing some types of protection orders.

Unfortunately, Domestic Violence is one of the most prevalent forms of abuse our country is facing. Every minute there are 9 reports of domestic abuse and violence. This is only the tip of the iceberg, it's estimated that at least 1/2 of the cases go unreported. Domestic violence knows no boundaries, neither economic status, race nor gender of the victim. The abuser and abused can be anyone, even your neighbor.

Prince of Peace as well as other churches, businesses and volunteers from our community, help Desert Rose with needed supplies and support.

We are asking you to help by donating to a drive for cleaning products in the month of April. The list and a brochure will be placed in your church mailbox. Please take your list and shop a little. The Desert Rose facility is short on storage, supplying usable quantities on a monthly basis will be greatly appreciated. There will be a check off list in the Narthex. If you donate, please check off the item you purchase, it will help keep duplicates to a minimum.

These women need to know they are safe and that they are worthy of our help. Many of these women have had no Christian life or church affiliation, they are unaware that help is available to them. Some may not have heard of Jesus, and his love for them.

You can help. You may know or suspect that someone is in need of help. Just offering a hand without judgement or questions, perhaps a prayer and a phone number is what may be needed to help someone move on to a better life.

There are brochures available in the Narthex. Take one, pass it along to someone else. Like forwarding an email, it just might make it into the hand of someone who needs to see it.
