From Fear to Faith

Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. 2 And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. 3 His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. 4 And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. 5 But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. 6 He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. 7 Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him. See, I have told you." 8 So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. 9 And behold, Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up and took hold of his feet and worshiped him. 10 Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me."

Matthew 28:1-10

On that first Easter morning, fear captivated the guards as they watched an angel descend from heaven and roll the stone away from the tomb. The guards were so filled with fear that they trembled and became like dead men. Fear was in the air on Easter morning as the disciples hid and the women went to the tomb.

Fear captivates our world today. What is it that you fear in life? Watching daily violence and death in the news may make you feel vulnerable to crime and fearing for your safety. A daily dose of coronavirus news makes us fear for our health. As we experience any illness or surgery, we grow fearful for our health and wellbeing. As we mourn for those who die, we become fearful of our own death. Hearing God's word, we may even fear the wrath of God,

acknowledging our sinful condition and our disobedience toward God. What is it that you are most afraid of today?

Fear is in the heart of all people as a result of our sinful condition. Ever since our first parents sinned in the Garden of Eden, fear has been in the hearts of people. Adam and Eve were afraid of God after they sinned and tried to hide from God. People have forever lived with a taste of fear in their lives as sinful beings before a holy righteous God.

The Easter message of Jesus' resurrection from the dead is a message that God wants you to believe in to take your fears away. I pray you are still in awe of the Easter message proclaimed for over 2,000 years. I pray you are still in awe that Jesus rose from the grave on Easter morning. This is the message that alleviates our fears. Placing our faith in this message, fear is replaced with faith in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

The first words we hear from the angel on Easter morning is "Do not be afraid." The message proclaimed is a message designed to relieve you of your fears. Our Lord lived His life telling His listeners to not be afraid of the future, for the Lord would care for them. Do you believe this to be true? After His resurrection, Jesus tells us to not be afraid for He is with us. Do you believe Jesus is with you? He promises His presence in our worship and reception of His sacraments. Nothing can separate us from His love. We do not need to fear God's wrath over our sins, because Jesus took this wrath upon Himself on the cross. We do not need to fear death, because Jesus rose from the grave and promises our resurrection as He prepares our eternal home with Him in heaven. Do you believe this Easter message?

The women were instructed to "go and tell" this message to the disciples. This is the message of God's Church, this is the message to God's people. This is our mission and God's message for us to proclaim. May the Holy Spirit fill you with faith in this message and relieve you of your fears this Easter.

This month's recipe comes from Bethany Asher
"Here is one of our favorites."

Crème Brulee French Toast

Ingredients

1 stick (1/2 cup) unsalted butter
1 cup packed brown sugar
2 tablespoons corn syrup
An 8-9 inch round loaf country-style bread
5 large eggs
1 1/2 cups half-and-half
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 teaspoon Grand Marnier
1/4 teaspoon salt.

Instructions

In a small heavy saucepan melt butter with brown sugar and corn syrup over moderate heat, stirring until smooth, and pour into a 13-by-9 by 2-inch baking dish.

Cut six 1-inch thick slices from the center portion of the bread, reserving the ends for another use, and trim crusts. Arrange bread slices in one layer in baking dish, squeezing them slightly to fit.

In a bowl, whisk together eggs, half and half, vanilla, Grand Marnier, and salt until combined well and pour evenly over bread.

Chill bread mixture, covered, at least 8 hours, and up to 1 day.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F and bring bread to room temperature.

Bake bread mixture, uncovered, in middle of oven until puffed and edges are pale golden, 35 to 45 minutes. Serve hot French Toast immediately.

“Here I Stand” Sunday April 18

On April 18, 1521, three and a half years after he nailed the 95 Theses to the church door in Wittenberg, Martin Luther made his historic stand at the Diet (official meeting) in the German city of Worms (pronounced “Vorms”). Accused of fostering heresy, he was directed by Charles V and other leaders to recant his teaching about the pure Gospel or face death.

As recounted in his collected works, Luther concluded his statement to the Diet with the words: “Since then your serene majesty and your lordships seek a simple answer, I will give it in this manner, neither horned nor toothed: Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures or by clear reason (for I do not trust either in the pope or in councils alone, since it is well known that they have often erred and contradicted themselves), I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not retract anything, since it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience.

“I cannot do otherwise, here I stand, may God help me, Amen” (LW 32:112-13).

On April 18, 2021, the Synod will commemorate the 500th anniversary of Luther’s defiant defense of the pure Gospel by observing “Here I Stand” Sunday, as called for by the adoption of Resolution 4-09 at the 2019 Synod convention. The resolution reads, in part: “WHEREAS, Scripture gives us encouragement with these words: ‘Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful’ (Heb. 10:23)...therefore be it Resolved, That April 18, 2021, be declared ‘Here I Stand’ Sunday throughout The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, its districts, circuits, and congregations...and be it finally Resolved, That our churches and people be encouraged to spend time in prayer, asking the Lord to continue to bless the proclamation of the Gospel.”

Good Samaritan Fund

Prince of Peace has created a means to help members facing financial needs. The Good Samaritan Fund can help with food, gas, utilities or rent. In this program needs of up to \$100.00 could be assessed and determined by Pastor. Larger amounts would be addressed by making an application for the need to Pastor or to the Chairperson of the Social Ministry Committee. These needs would be reviewed by the Social Ministry Committee. A maximum of \$1,000 per year would be available to a family for this support. The funds will come entirely from contributions to the Social Ministry Fund. All distributions are confidential.
