From Vicar

I have just registered for classes for my last year of seminary. In fewer than 60 days, the Schultzes will be moving once again. This year has truly flown by, and I think I would appreciate a second vicarage before someone starts calling me *Pastor* Schultz. Many of my friends and classmates have just received their own vicarage placements or their calls to the ministry; they too are looking forward to the next step, eager to start, though somewhat apprehensive about what the future holds.

Transitions of all sorts can make us apprehensive: from graduations to new jobs, from weddings to having the first child or grandchild, from employment anniversaries to retirements, from moving to assisted living to funeral planning. What does the future hold for us? When can I finally be happy with where I'm at? How long can I keep a steady rhythm going before it all changes again?

For the first two Sundays of June, we will celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord (May 30th, observed June 2nd) and Pentecost (June 9th). To say the least, these were each *tremendous* transitions for the disciples. In the span of a month and a half, their friend and master had died, risen, appeared several times to them, and had now bodily ascended into the heavens (Luke 24:50-52; Acts 1:6-11). In Acts, St. Luke records that the disciples remained gazing into the sky, as if waiting for Jesus to come back immediately with all the company of heaven in glorious ranks: they expected judgment day then and there! What reason could Jesus have in waiting to return? Jesus' own last words before ascending had given the reason: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8). Christ commanded his disciples to carry His Name and Gospel throughout all the world, to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you"

(Matt. 28:19b-20A). With this command to baptize and teach, Jesus also assured them, "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matt. 28:20b). No longer would Jesus walk with his disciples as he had for the previous three years. Now he pointed them to baptism as their source of comfort and assurance in his lasting presence. Yet the disciples—ever slow to understand—stayed on that mount of the ascension gazing up into the clouds. Then two angels, clothed in white robes, joined them and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will com in the same way as you saw him go into heaven" (Acts 1:11). Said another way, "The kingdom of God certainly comes by itself without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may come to us also" (Small Catechism, Second Petition of the Lord's Prayer).

Jesus will certainly be returning in glory and judgment, but we do not know when He will make this last triumphant and visible appearance. Until then, we don't wait for Him by looking into the clouds like the disciples, but we listen to Jesus' command to baptize and teach all nations—that is how God's kingdom comes today. Baptism guarantees that Jesus Will be with us until the very end of the age when He returns because Jesus Himself said so! Thus, through all of our transitions in life, good or less good, anticipated or surprising, major or minor, we have the comfort that God's love and grace will never leave us. Not even the transition of death needs to frighten us. Even there, God promises that our baptism will keep us safe and ready for Jesus' glorious and triumphant return.

"Death, you cannot end my gladness: I am baptized into Christ!

When I die, I leave all sadness To inherit paradise!

Though I lie in dust and ashes Faith's assurance brightly flashes:

Baptism has the strength divine To make life immortal mine." (LSB 594:4)
